BACKGROUND

- Department of Health of the Philippines has shown strong commitment to a more integrated approach to address PSCM challenges.
- One challenge is how to ensure ongoing PSCM improvements at the local government unit (LGU) level beyond the project development life cycle.
- A consensus building approach, key informant interviews, focus groups and learning sessions were used to engage stakeholders from levels of government, implementing partners and academia
- Supported by USAID, MTaPS worked with stakeholders to develop the PSCM Local Technical Assistance Providers Scheme (LTAPS) for LGUs to meet this aim.

RESULTS AT THIS STAGE

- Agreed on the following objectives for LTAPS graduates:
 - Advocate with LGU leaders for improved understanding of PSCM development
 - Assess PSCM services at the LGU level against a defined end state
 - Develop LGU PSCM improvement plans specific to the LGU
- Support LGU in the change management process.
- A four-phased approach was agreed to achieve this:
 - Advocacy and engagement
 - LTAPS Program materials development-ToolKit (using PtD STEP 2.0 as a basis)
 - Delivery of LTAPS program
 - Integration of program into local institutions

CONCLUSIONS

- For universal health coverage to be a reality, mature PSCM systems need to be in place.
- We need to focus on initiatives that build up supply chain leaders with the change management skills needed to make a difference in their local context.
- LTAPS approach developed in the Philippines demonstrates that through a consensus building approach solutions with the potential for lasting impact are possible.

LESSONS LEARNT

- Plan with final sustainability in mind
- The journey to a capacity development solution is just as important as the final product
- Development of immature PSCM systems takes a coordinated effort that needs time to complete
